Here is the list of candidates that have offered their services thus far, these fellow Knights have agreed to run for the following Offices in 2023-2024.

Chaplain: *Fr. Michael Trummer* from St. Boniface, this is an appointed office.

- A priest chosen annually by the grand knight, deputy grand knight and board of trustees.
- Acts as spiritual advisor to the brother Knights and families of the council.
- Provides his message to members at the beginning of the meeting as outlined in the Method of Conducting Council Meetings #10318.

Grand Knight: Candidate Neil Joellenbeck

- Presides over all council meetings.
- Appoints program and membership directors.
- Appoints committees as needed.
- Countersigns orders for payment and checks.
- Ensures the submission of all paperwork required by the Supreme and State Councils.
- Maintains a working relationship with the council's chaplain, district deputy, field agent, and general agent, as well as with other local service organizations, and the local parish.
- Has a working knowledge of the Knights of Columbus website, Officers Online and Member Management.
- Responsible for council's Admission Degree Team and the scheduling of frequent Admission Ceremonials.

Deputy Grand Knight: NO CANDIDATE

- Assists the grand knight with operation of the council.
- Presides at council meetings in the absence of the grand knight.
- Is recommended to serve on the council's retention committee.
- Has a working knowledge of the Knights of Columbus website, Officers Online and Member Management.
- Performs other such duties as the grand knight may direct.

Chancellor: NO CANDIDATE

- Assists the grand knight and deputy grand knight with their duties, as assigned.
- Is entrusted with strengthening the members' interest in council activities.
- Is recommended to serve as chairman of the Admission Committee.
- Performs other such duties as the grand knight may direct.

Recorder: NO CANDIDATE

- Responsible for keeping and maintaining a true and permanent record of all actions of the council using a Reorder's Minute Book #1403.
- Maintains all correspondence of the council.
- Reads the bills entered into the minutes for discussion.
- Performs other such duties as the grand knight may direct.

Financial Secretary: **Jeff Davis** This is an appointed office.

Appointed by the supreme knight for a three-year term upon grand knight and trustees' recommendation.

Treasurer: Candidate Vernon Zurliene

- Handles council funds.
- Receives money from the Financial Secretary and deposits it in the proper accounts.
- Maintains all council checking accounts.
- Is responsible for paying all council expenses.
- Performs other such duties as the grand knight may direct.

Lecturer: **Jerry Kapp** This is an appointed office.

- Is responsible for providing suitable educational and entertainment programs under the "Good of the Order" section at council meetings.
- Stays abreast of developments within the council's charitable, membership and social programs.
- Performs other such duties as the grand knight may direct.

Advocate: Candidate Lynn Ripper

- Acts as parliamentarian for the council.
- Has working knowledge of Method of Conducting Council Meetings.
- Knows the council bylaws and the Order's Charter, Constitution and Laws # 30.
- Has access to Officers Online and Officer's Desk Reference.
- Seeks legal assistance from the state advocate as needed.
- Performs other such duties as the grand knight may direct.

Warden: NO CANDIDATE

- Supervises and maintains all council property.
- Arranges the council chamber for meetings and degree exemplifications.
- Oversees inside and outside guards.
- Performs other such duties as the grand knight may direct.

Inside Guard: Candidate Joseph Marti

Outside Guard: Candidate Floyd Frey

- Attending the doors of the council chamber, checking for current membership cards and allowing entrance.
- Performs other such duties as the grand knight may direct.

Third Year Trustee: Candidate Dustin Riechmann

- At each regular election, the position of each trustee will be voted upon, with the current three and two-year trustee potentially moving on to become the two and one-year trustee.
- Supervises all financial procedures of the council and conducts semiannual audits.
- Ensures the proper protocol and procedures are followed by the council for payment of monies however, cannot override the vote of the council's membership.

K of C Fish Fry

Council 1143 has been serving up delicious fish dinners for over 40 years. Year in and year out the council has hosted a fish fry twice a month. Over the years the fish fry has been our major fund raiser and we have donated countless dollars to Catholic grade schools and many other charitable outreaches.

The fish fry is held on the first and third Friday of each month from 4:30 – 7:00pm. During Lent we have a fish fry on every Friday 4:30-7:30pm. The menu includes fried cod, catfish and shrimp, both as a sandwich or as a plate with two sides including cole slaw, potato salad, green beans, French fries, and macaroni and cheese. We also serve onion rings, hush puppies, and clam chowder.

There are four teams who work on a rotating basis. Each team is comprised of a cashier, a bartender, a kitchen crew, a fry shack crew, and a dining room crew. It takes between 18-24 members to man a fish fry. Lou Carnoali, Dennis Hessel, and Rob Savant serve as co-chairs for the Fish Fry.

Over the last few years many of the teams have lost members due to age, illness, death, and srelocation out of the area. We need our new knights and old timers to step up and volunteer to serve on a team every other month for 3 hours.

With the Lent coming soon, **please consider volunteering** for the fish fry. Please don't hesitate to contact me if you have any questions or would like to join a team.

Building the Domestic Church

The Sacrament of Marriage

The foundation of the domestic church is the sacrament of marriage. It is therefore important to reflect often on the mystery and calling of this sacrament. Also, our children may be called to become spouses and parents, so it is important to help them understand the type of love that is necessary in marriage and family life.

Breaking Open the Theme

The sacrament of marriage is a wondrous divine mystery. As Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen liked to remind couples, it takes "three" to get married: husband, wife and God. By virtue of the sacrament of baptism, Christians no longer belong to themselves, but to Jesus Christ. As a result, when a baptized man marries a baptized woman, Christ himself is the one who gives the spouses to each other on their wedding day.

It is Christ who also receives their vows as the Church witnesses their exchange of love and blesses it in Christ's name. This is why it is important to celebrate the sacrament of marriage in a church where the Blessed Sacrament is present and also why the Church recommends that Christian marriages take place within a Mass. Christ, who is truly present in the Blessed Sacrament, is made present in the love of the spouses. He becomes the source and unshakable guarantor of their unity as a couple. He transforms their love: "Spouses love each other with a love that is greater than themselves, in fact, with the very love that brought them into existence in the first place!"

By virtue of the great sacrament of holy matrimony, human love participates in Christ's own sacrificial love wherein he gave up his body for sinners on the cross. To receive the graces of this sacrament fully, married couples must enter into the total self-gift of Christ on a daily basis, holding nothing back in their love of each other through prayer and sacrifice for the good of the beloved.

Meditations

From a homily by St. John Chrysostom on Mar-

riage and Family Life

How is marriage a mystery? The two have become one. This is not an empty symbol. They have not become the image of anything on earth, but of God Himself. ... They come to be made into one body. See the mystery of love! If the two do not become one, they cannot increase; they can increase only by decreasing! How great is the strength of unity!

From Pope John Paul II's Familiaris Consortio

The Spirit which the Lord pours forth [in the sacrament of marriage] gives a new heart, and renders man and woman capable of loving one another as Christ has loved us. Conjugal love reaches that fullness to which it is interiorly ordained, conjugal charity, which is the proper and specific way in which the spouses participate in and are called to live the very charity of Christ who gave Himself on the Cross. ... Spouses are therefore the permanent reminder to the Church of what happened on the Cross; they are for one another and for the children witnesses to the salvation in which the sacrament makes them sharers.

- 1. Do we think of marriage differently when we remember that Christ is present in the sacrament of marriage? How does this change or challenge our personal views of love?
- 2. What do we think of St. John Chrysostom's principle of Christian married love that spouses and family "increase" by "decreasing"? How does this principle relate to the words that we hear from John the Baptist: "He must increase; I must decrease" (Jn 3:30)?
