## Grand Knight's Letter

Hello Brother Knights,

Happy Spring! You may not be aware but my tenure as your Grand Knight is reaching an end. Stop cheering!!!! As my time is winding down, I wanted to speak to the Council's programming efforts.

In June we will elect new officers to take on the new Fraternal Year beginning at the July 2023 General Council Meeting. The Fraternal Planner resets and we begin again with our programming efforts. These programming efforts are our "Faith in Action" activities. You may ask, (as I did) what is "Faith in Action"? Faith in Action is the umbrella for all Supreme Councilrecommended programs. Under this umbrella we operate programming under four categories, Faith, Family, Community, and Life.

Within the last Fraternal Year, the following list is what we have and will accomplish under each of these categories:

#### Faith:

- Quarterly Holy Hours: one hour of silent praying in the Adoration Chapel at St. Boniface Church.
- Quarterly Corporate Communions/Exemplifications of the 1<sup>st</sup>,

- 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> Degrees Ceremony/ Delta Church Drive for new memberships.
- Council participation in the Staterun Vocations Raffle. Effort to support Seminarians within our State.
- 4. The St. Joseph Icon Prayer Service: An hour of community praying with the St. Joseph Icon.
- s. Lend a Rosary/Keep a Rosary program: Three Knights of Columbus Rosary Stands were placed in our two local parish churches, and one in the St. Boniface Adoration Chapel. The stands are populated with Knights of Columbus Rosaries which can be borrowed or kept when a parishioner finds themselves in need of a rosary. The Council hopes this effort increases the praying of the rosary and gains some good will marketing from those who use the stands.
- 6. Refund Support Vocations Program (RSVP). The Knights of Columbus stands in solidarity with our priests and religious! Through the Refund Support Vocations Program (RSVP), the council and parish families raise funds to support seminarians in their area.
- Rosary for the Souls in Purgatory Program: Council Knights and parishioners walk both parish

- cemeteries praying the rosary and other prayers for the souls of parishioners interned at each cemetery.
- 8. Silent Candlelight Eucharistic Procession: Lead by the Knights of our Council, parishioners from both parishes participate in a Eucharistic Procession from St. Boniface through downtown Edwardsville. The procession is just after dusk, participants pray in silence, holding luminaries, following our Lord as a display of our faith while praying for World Peace.

#### Family:

- 1. Keep Christ in Christmas Poster Contest: Children at both Parish Schools make posters. Each poster er must reflect the Keep Christ in Christmas theme with a visual image.
- 2. Scholarship Program: Council runs the Parkfest Food Stand each year at the LeClair Parkfest. The proceeds fund Council 1143's Scholarship Program. Each year the Council awards two \$500 Scholarships for incoming Freshman who wish to attend Father McGivney High School

and two \$500 College Scholarships to two High School seniors who are applying to attend college. All awardees must have a father or grandfather who is a Knight in "good standing" in our Council or 4<sup>th</sup> Degree Assembly.

- 3. Food for Families: Each fall and spring our Council host a food drive to collect food stuffs and funds to support our local food pantry.
- 4. Children in Need/Christmas Shopping Spree: Each fall the local school district will identify children in need. Our Council will provide funding to take each child on a Christmas present shopping spree at our local Walmart. Following the shopping spree, the Council hosts a gift-wrapping party at the Hall, ensuring each of the children served has a nice Christmas morning.
- 5. Consecration of The Holy Family:
  Knights man the doors before and after each of the weekend Masses at both parishes handing out Holy Family Prayer Cards. The hope is that each one receiving the prayer card will bring their family together of a moment of prayer to the Holy Family.
- 6. Father/Daughter Dance: Council hosts a meal and a dance for Fathers & Daughters of all ages just before Valentine's Day.

#### Community:

- Coats for Kids: Each late fall, the Council asks for membership donations to cover the cost for new coats for kids in need. Depending on the funds collected two to four cases of new coats are purchased and given to a local agency to distribute to children in need of a warm winter coat.
- 2. KC Soccer Challenge: Several nights over a fall week the Council sets up a Soccer Challenge at a soccer goal near where community soccer players are practicing.

- These boys and girls have the opportunity to win at the local level and then go on to participate at the district/state/and national level if they so desire!
- Highway Cleanup: Quarterly our Knights walk the highway in front of the Hall and clean up debris from the Hall into Edwardsville and back, cleaning both sides of the roadway.
- 4. Free Throw Challenge: In January the Council hosts a basketball free-throw contest where council level winners can participate in the district/state/national contest if they continue to win at each level.
- 5. Hops for Heroes: The Council along with the Local Moose Lodge conducts a "beer tasting" event. All proceeds are donated to the St. Louis Honor Flights program to provide trips to veterans to Washington DC to see their "wars" memorials.
- Breakfast with St. Nick: Council Knights cook and serve breakfast to families and children who wish to have a Sunday morning visit with St. Nick.
- Catholic Boy Scout Awards: Council and Assembly 225 support the
  purchase of Faith awards to be
  presented to the local Catholic Boy
  Scout Troop.

#### Life:

- Blood Drives: Council support and provides the Hall for a Bi-Monthly Blood Drive.
- 2. 40 Days for Life: Every fall and spring the Council provides two Knights per hour to cover a 12-hour day from 7:00am to 7:00pm praying silently on the curb outside the Granite City Abortion Mill.
- 3. I.D. Drive: Council Knights man positions outside local businesses to collect funds to support the Knights of Columbus Intellectual Disabilities Drive, (Tootsie Roll Drive) This is a National Campaign.
- 4. Silver Rose Prayer Service: This past year this was a District event

- that your Council participated in. This program shares the message of Our Lady of Guadalupe and promotes respect for life by participating in a meaningful pilgrimage. The Silver Rose program demonstrates the unity between Knights of Columbus in Canada, the United States and Mexico, through a series of prayer services promoting the dignity of all human life and honoring Our Lady. The Silver Rose starts in Canada and moves across the US on its way to Mexico.
- 5. Rosary for Life: Council Knights meet every second Saturday of the month at 9:00am to pray the rosary for an end to abortion. In the late spring and summer, the Knights meet on the curb outside the Granite City Abortion Mill and pray aloud the Rosary of Our Lady. In the winter months and in bad weather this rosary service is held in St. Mary's Church.

If, as a member of this Council, you feel that we are not addressing a need that we should, now is the time to get that need into the hopper! Within this past year, I was asked if we had ever had a Prison Ministry in the form of praying a rosary for inmates on "Death Row". I told the fellow Knight who had made the enquiry that I was not aware that our Council had ever had a Life program that addressed that need but there was no reason why we could not start one!

Anything is possible within the Council! Your voice is just as important as any other voice, you just have to get up off the couch, come to a meeting, and "SPEAK UP"!

## March for Life in Springfield ...

Thousands of anti-abortion advocates descended upon Springfield Tuesday, marking the first Illinois March for Life in the post-Roe era. Two knights from our council and a guest traveled to SPringield to participate in this event.

The day included multiple events at the University of Illinois-Springfield, Trinity Lutheran Church and on the state Capitol grounds. Advocates on both sides of the issues made plans to meet with lawmakers amid a busy week of floor action in the 103rd General Assembly.

Prior to scheduled rallies and a march around the Capitol grounds, a Roman Catholic mass service was held at Sangamon Auditorium. Springfield Bishop Thomas J. Paprocki led the service before a crowd of families and high school religious groups from across the state. Groups traveled to the Capitol from Chicago and Rockford and other parts of the state. Springfield Sacred Heart-Griffin senior Blake Troyer attended the mass after hearing from multiple anti-abortion presenters this school year.

Although not Catholic, Troyer said he has heard Paprocki speak several times and welcomed the bishop's remarks on abortion. "It's always great to hear from the bishop," he said. "He's a strong voice for our state." Paprocki, renowned for his anti-abortion stance, endorsed the nation's highest court decision for "rightfully" making the legality of abortion a question for states to decide. The bishop pushed for a resurged effort to change laws in states like Illinois where abortion is protected.

Mercy and Forgiveness

The inner form of Christian familial love is mercy like God the Father who is "rich in mercy" (Eph 2:4).

## Breaking Open the Theme

Pope St. John Paul II has beautifully said mercy is "love's second name." Sacred Scripture speaks frequently about Christ's love in terms of mercy. For instance, there are the memorable parables of the prodigal son (Lk 15:11–32) and the lost sheep (Lk 15:1-7). In fact, Christ's strongest teaching about the sacredness and life long permanence of the marriage bond (Mt 19:12) is preceded by one of his strongest teachings about forgiveness in the parable of the unforgiving servant (Mt 18:21-35).

During the course of the parable of the unforgiving servant, Christ instructs his disciples to forgive not just seven times, but 77 times — a symbolic number that represents a willingness to forgive without limit. In other words, Christ instructs his disciples to love unconditionally by being merciful. The fact that this teaching occurs right before his teaching about marriage's indissolubility powerfully suggests that marriage, and the family life that flows from it, is to be held together by unconditional mercy. If the family practices mercy, they will be immensely blessed: "Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy" (Mt 5:7).

#### Meditation

From Pope Francis' Amoris Laetitia

Once we allow ill will to take root in our hearts, it leads to deep resentment. ... The opposite of resentment is forgiveness, which is rooted in a positive attitude that seeks to understand other people's weaknesses and to excuse them. As Jesus said, "Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do" (Lk 23:34). Yet we keep looking for more and more faults, imagining greater evils, presuming all kinds of bad in-

tentions, and so resentment grows and deepens. ... Something is wrong when we see every problem as equally serious; in this way, we risk being unduly harsh with the failings of others. The just desire to see our rights respected turns into a thirst for vengeance rather than a reasoned defense of our dignity.

When we have been offended or let down, forgiveness is possible and desirable, but no one can say that it is easy. ... All this assumes that we ourselves have had the experience of being forgiven by God, justified by his grace and not by our own merits. We have known a love that is prior to any of our own efforts, a love that constantly opens doors, promotes and encourages. If we accept that God's love is unconditional, that the Father's love cannot be bought or sold, then we will become capable of showing boundless love and forgiving others even if they have wronged us. Otherwise, our family life will no longer be a place of understanding, support and encouragement, but rather one of constant tension and mutual criticism.

- Considering that Jesus forgave his persecutors from the cross, what does God's mercy in the Scriptures teach us about how to forgive our family members?
- 2. Why is it important to be forgiven by God? Why must we trust in his forgiveness in order to forgive others properly?
- 3. Do any of us find it hard to forgive? What holds us back from forgiving? Is it resentment based on ill will, unduly looking for faults, an excessive concern for our rights, the inability to forgive ourselves or to accept our own limitations? Or is it something else?

A prayer of penance and longing for God's abundant mercy

Have mercy on me, God, in accord with your merciful love; in your abundant compassion blot out my transgressions. Thoroughly wash away my guilt; and from my sin cleanse me.
