Scripture has a lot to say about being adequate for the task. Recall how God led the prophet Samuel to anoint an unlikely choice, the shepherd boy, David, as the future king of Israel. No one thought David was adequate to the task, not even himself. The lesson? God doesn't measure our potential according to human standards. He measures our hearts, then equips us for the task. David soon learned this truth when he found himself facing the Philistine giant, Goliath!

The apostle Paul came to know it too. He wrote

about the effectiveness of his ministry, saying. "Not that we are competent in ourselves to claim anything for ourselves, but our competence is from God" (2Cor.3:5.) Later, he reiterates his point, saying, "...But we have this treasure in jars of clay, to show that this all-surpassing power is from God and not from us" (2Cor.4L7.)

God calls upon all His people to serve Him. The first thought many Christians have when asked to help in an area outside their comfort zone is that they aren't cut out for that type of work. Humanly speaking, they are right, but that is why God steps in and provides what's needed to do any task He calls them to do. And He encourages them by His Spirit and the support of those who have found Him to be a faithful guide.

So, if you are the person that thinks you can't volunteer because you don't have the skills or the courage or the time, you are precisely the person who should help, because you will be relying on the competence of God, rather than your own!


