Enhanced Fraternal Benefits

Last month at the General Agents Meeting in Dallas, after consultation with many agents, Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly announced exciting enhancements to our Fraternal Benefits which are effective immediately.

Member/Spouse Accidental Death Benefit:

Members in good standing and their spouses in the U.S. and Canada receive accidental death coverage at no additional cost. This coverage has now been increased, simplified, and made more attractive for insured members and their spouses.

Prior to recent changes, the maximum coverage amount was \$2,500. With the new enhancements, the maximum coverage has now doubled.

Family Fraternal Benefits:

Insured members receive additional family fraternal benefits, that cover them in the event of infant deaths, stillbirths and provide guaranteed insurance coverage for juvenile children in many circumstances, even if those children are uninsurable.

Prior to recent changes, insured members whose children were stillborn after 20 weeks or died within 60 days after birth were eligible for a \$1,500 death benefit. With the new enhancements, the death benefit amount has increased to \$5,000.

Prior to recent changes, insured members with hard-to-insure or uninsurable children had the opportunity to purchase a guaranteed-issue policy for \$5,000. With the new enhancements, the guaranteed-issue death benefit has increased to \$10,000.

Insured members who have already taken advantage of this benefit and purchased a \$5,000 guaranteed-issue policy, can purchase an additional \$5,000 of coverage on eligible children.

Orphan Fraternal Benefit:

The orphaned children of insured members are eligible for a monthly stipend to cover care costs and liv-

ing expenses, as well as college scholarships. Prior to recent changes, the monthly stipend was \$80 up to age 18, and the college scholarships were \$1,750 per year with a maximum scholarship of \$7,000 over four years.

With the new enhancements, the monthly stipend has increased to \$500, and the college scholarship has increased to \$5,000 per year, with a maximum scholarship of \$20,000 over four years.

Spousal Right to Apply:

Widows of insured members also have the right to purchase Knights of Columbus products after the death of their spouse.

Prior to recent changes, that right expired one year after their spouse's death.

With the new enhancements, the one-year restriction has been removed.

These benefits are unique to our mission of helping create a secure and stable financial foundation for our fellow Catholic families.

There is a good chance many of our members and prospective members don't know these benefits exist. So, the next time you're talking to a prospective member, mention our Enhanced Fraternal Benefits. You just might sign-up a New Member that day!

Building the Domestic Church

While Strengthening Our Parish The Family Fully Alive

Hospitality

Scripture speaks frequently about the importance of a family's hospitality because of its lifegiving love that nourishes weary souls and heals broken hearts.



Breaking Open the Theme

Hospitality is necessary for a Christian family as a domestic church. It is part of a Christian's mission (Heb 13:2, Rom 12:13, Mt 10:42, Lk 10:29–37, Gn 18:1-10). But what is hospitality? Christ teaches us through the parable of the Good Samaritan (Lk 10:29 -37) that one dimension of hospitality is "to make a neighbor of a stranger." Hospitality, as the word itself and the parable of the Good Samaritan suggest, helps to heal others, like a hospital.

Yet the concept of Christian hospitality goes even deeper. The Rule of St. Benedict states, "All guests who present themselves are to be welcomed as Christ, for he himself will say: 'I was a stranger and you welcomed me." Christian hospitality, then, is not just merely being kind and welcoming toward the stranger or our own family members; it is welcoming all as Christ.

This radical Christian hospitality by families can occur in many simple ways. We can invite people over for a celebration or regular family activities, serve a home-cooked meal, wave hello to neighbors from the porch or even ask others to join for family prayer. The possibilities are endless. The key is that families not just open the door but also open their hearts with love toward others, sharing a love that is warm and life-giving like Christ's.

Meditation

From Pope Francis' Amoris Laetitia

Led by the Spirit, the family circle is not only open to **Continued on next page....** life by generating within itself, but also by going forth and spreading life by caring for others and seeking their happiness. This openness finds particular expression in hospitality, which the word of God eloquently encourages: "Do not neglect to show hos-

pitality to strangers, for thereby some have entertained angels unaware" (Heb 13:2). When a family is welcoming and reaches out to others, especially the poor and the neglected, it is "a symbol, witness and participant in the Church's motherhood." Social love, as a reflection of the Trinity, is what truly unifies the spiritual meaning of the family and its mission to others, for it makes present the kerygma [teachings] in all its communal imperatives. The family lives its spirituality precisely by being at one and the same time a domestic church and a vital cell for transforming the world.

- 1. What are some specific ways in which our family practices hospitality within our home? In what ways is hospitality challenging for our family, and in what ways does it help our family grow in grace and happiness?
- 2. Have we ever thought of hospitality in terms of welcoming the other as Christ? How might this calling of Christian hospitality change our practices of hospitality?
- 3. What are some ways as a family to grow in hospitality? How might we open our home more to the poor, lonely, brokenhearted and neglected? Is there someone who has a rough family life that could use some time around our family for the support and encouragement that love offers?


