The Color Guard will lead the procession and will post on the Band Stand during the Benediction Service. The procession will then return to the St. Boniface Parking Lot. If the procession begins at sunset (8:30pm) the procession should return to the St. Boniface Parking Lot by 9:30pm. St. Boniface Church Parking Lot is at 128 North Buchanan Street Edwardsville, Il 62025

The Honor Guard will gather at 8:00pm with the procession beginning sometime around sunset. (Sunset is at 8:30pm.) The event should be approximately one hour.



Fundamental Prayers

Sign of the Cross

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Apostles' Creed

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended into hell; on the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

Our Father

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

O my God, I love thee above all things, with my whole heart and soul, because thou art all good and worthy of all love. I love my neighbor as myself for the love of thee. I forgive all who have injured me, and ask pardon of all whom I have injured. Amen.

O my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended thee and I detest all my sins, because I dread the loss of heaven and the pains of hell; but most of all because they offended thee, my God, who are all good and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve, with the help of thy grace, to confess my sins, to do penance, and to amend my life. Amen.

holy and righteous in his sight all the days of our life. You, my child, shall be called the prophet of the Most High;

for you will go before the Lord to prepare his way, to give his people knowledge of salvation by the forgiveness of their sins.
