He appoints committees, counter-sign orders and checks. He serves as the Chairman of the Board of Trustees and is an ex-officio member of all committees. He is responsible for establishing a Color Corps and annually appoints or reappoints the Assembly Color Corps Compreme Assembly may impose.

FAITHFUL COMPTROLLER (Similar to Financial Secretary): The Faithful Comptroller shall keep a roll and the records of the members with the date of their initiation in the Fourth Degree. He shall collect and receive all monies due to the Assembly and all funds obtained from any source and transfer the same to the Faithful Purser and obtain a receipt from him. He shall keep accounts of the charges and receipts of each member and issue to each member not indebted to the Assembly for dues, a Fourth Degree Membership Card. He shall, upon request by a member transferring to another assembly, issue a transfer card, signed by the Faithful Navigator and attested by the Faithful Comptroller. He shall keep such necessary Official Records and forms as furnished by the Supreme Secretary. He shall notify the District Master of the names of all candidates awaiting initiation. EUCHARISTIC PROCESSION

A Eucharistic Procession, just like Eucharistic Adoration, is an extension of the worship of Jesus Christ, truly present in the Blessed Sacrament. The supreme act of adoration and the source and summit of the Christian life is the celebration of the Mass, and that celebration is prolonged and intensified through Eucharistic worship outside of the Mass. In Eucharistic Processions, the missionary aspect of the Eucharist is emphasized as we go forth into the world. Not only gazing upon our Eucharistic Lord, but walking with him, we experience what the disciples did 2000 years ago as they walked with Jesus, proclaiming the Good News to the world. A parish community that undertakes a Eucharistic Procession has made the decision to publicly proclaim its belief in Jesus' True Presence in the Eucharist. By this public witness of faith, the parish invites people in the community to encounter the Risen Lord present in the Eucharistic Host. For those who participate in the procession, it is an opportunity not only to proclaim their faith but also to grow in their faith. The procession is, finally, an invitation to Jesus himself to be a part of our daily lives, to be immersed in the world in which we live.

On Sunday June 22, 2025, the Edwardsville Knights of Columbus and the Catholic Parishes of Edwardsville & Glen

Carbon, IL will host a Eucharistic Candlelight Procession to celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christie. All parishioners, and members of the Knights of Columbus and their families are invited to participate.

The Eucharistic Procession will begin at dusk and will process from the St. Boniface Church main parking lot through Edwardsville streets stopping for the Benediction Service at the Edwardsville City Park Band Stand. The procession will then return to the St. Boniface Parking Lot. The event should be approximately one hour.

Devotional Prayers to the Blessed Virgin Mary



Angelus

Catholics traditionally recite the following prayer at dawn, midday and sunset throughout the year, except during the Easter season.

- V. The angel of the Lord declared unto Mary.
- R. And she conceived of the Holy Spirit. (Hail Mary)
- V. Behold the handmaid of the Lord.
- R. Be it done unto me according to thy word. (Hail Mary)
- V. And the Word was made flesh.
- R. And dwelt among us. (Hail Mary)
- V. Pray for us, O Holy Mother of God.
- R. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.
- V. Let us pray.
- R. Pour forth, we beseech thee, O Lord, thy grace into our hearts, that we to whom the incarnation of Christ, thy son, was made known by the message of an angel, may, by his passion and cross, be brought to the glory of his resurrection. Through the same Christ, our Lord. Amen.

Regina Caeli

During the Easter season, the Angelus is replaced with the Regina Caeli.

- V. Queen of Heaven; rejoice, alleluia.
- R. For he whom thou didst to merit to bear, alleluia.
- V. Has risen as he said, alleluia.
- R. Pray for us to God, alleluia.
- V. Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary, alleluia.
- R. Because the Lord is truly risen, alleluia.
- V. Let us pray.
- R. O God, who through the resurrection of thy son, our Lord Jesus Christ, deigned to gladden the world: grant, we beseech thee, that through the Virgin Mary, his mother, we may attain the joys of eternal life. Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Memorare

Remember, O most gracious Virgin Mary, that never was it

known that anyone who fled to thy protection, implored thy help or sought thy intercession, was left unaided. Inspired by this confidence, I fly unto thee, O Virgin of Virgins, my Mother. To thee do I come, before thee I stand sinful and sorrowful. O Mother of the Word Incarnate, despise not my petitions, but in thy mercy, hear and answer me. Amen.

Prayer to Our Lady of Guadalupe

God of power and mercy, you blessed the Americas at Tepeyac with the presence of the Virgin Mary of Guadalupe. May her prayers help all men and women to accept each other as brothers and sisters. Through your justice present in our hearts, may your peace reign in the world. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

The Rosary or the Blessed Virgin Mary

A Scripture-based prayer, the rosary provides an opportunity for Catholics to meditate on significant events that are essential to our Faith. The four sets of mysteries — Joyful, Sorrowful, Glorious and Luminous — guide our thoughts to consider particular events of Christ's life. Through praying the rosary, we bring our needs and prayers to Christ, asking that, through the intercession of his Blessed Mother, they may be granted and our families blessed with peace.

To begin the rosary:

- 1. While holding the crucifix, make the Sign of the Cross and recite the Apostles' Creed.
- 2. On the first large bead, recite the Our Father.
- 3. Recite the Hail Mary on the following three small beads, praying for an increase in the virtues of faith, hope and love.
- 4. Recite the Doxology.

For each decade:

- 1. Recite the name of the mystery, and recite the Our Father on the next large bead.
- 2. On each of the 10 small beads which follow, recite a Hail Mary.

Devotional Prayers to the Blessed Virgin Mary continued...

3. Recite the Doxology and the Fatima Prayer (see pages 54-55) on the space before the next large bead.

Concluding prayers to the rosary:

Hail, holy queen, mother of mercy, our life, our sweetness and our hope! To you do we cry, poor banished children of Eve. To you do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this vale of tears. Turn then, most gracious advocate, your eyes of mercy toward us and after this our exile, show unto us the blessed fruit of your womb, Jesus. O clement, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary.

- V. Pray for us, most holy Mother of God.
- R. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.
- V. Let us pray.

R. O God, whose only-begotten Son by his life, death and resurrection has purchased for us the rewards of eternal life: grant, we beseech you, that meditating on these mysteries in the most holy rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise. Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.
