### ***Faithful Navigator's Letter:***

Fellow Knights!

What an amazing July! We were excited to host our District Master Kevin Schoenborn at our Hall to conduct Officer Installation, which included a special devotion and heritage lesson, on the life of brother Knight Fred Mills. Fred was a furniture salesman in downtown Edwardsville, and at the age of 30 he volunteered and became private in the US Army's 79<sup>th</sup> Infantry Division, 315<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment. He made the ultimate sacrifice fighting Nazis in northern France during Operation Overlord in 1945. After WWII ended, our council officers started the Fred Mills Club in his honor, and it remains the namesake of our hall to this day.

Every year, July is a wonderful and eventful month, important to all of us Sir Knights who made a pledge to the Fourth Principal of Patriotism! Undoubtedly the month of Independence Day should be a time to come together and celebrate our nation and our heritage, but in modern times it can create divisions. Does waving the flag mean I am a part of a political party, conservative or liberal? Red or blue? Am I confusing Patriotism with Nationalism? Fred Mills gave his life fighting nationalist Nazis in France as a part of the Greatest Generation – that is undoubtedly Patriotic! But what can I do, here at home? I've discerned this virtue more this year than ever, and was led to an excellent article by author Jayme



## Who was the Fred Mills Club named after????

Researched by Faithful Navigator Jason Jones

The short answer—Fred Joseph Mills: Private, World War II

Fred J. Mills was born December 6, 1912 in Graves County, Kentucky. He was the son of Edward Mills and Mary Cordella Bolds. He was married to Edith Mills and had been living in Edwardsville, Illinois working as a furniture salesman on Main Street in Edwardsville, when he entered the service as Private (PVT) Mills, an Infantryman with the 315th Infantry Regiment, 79th Infantry Division in World War II. He was a brother Knight, probably a parishioner at St. Boniface, assumed by geography and the 1940 Census. I checked .with the other Mills we know in the area John & Sherry mills, and Joe & Christy (Mills) Lombardi, who didn't find a Fred Mills in their family trees.

The 79th Infantry Division wore the “Cross of Lorraine” during World War I and World War II, the same herald borne by Joan of Arc in the 15th Century Hundred-Years War and by the French Revolution. This Division's colors still fly in the U.S. Army Reserve as the 79th Theater Support Command in Los Alamos, CA, hosting logistic and support units.

PVT Mills 315th Infantry Regiment bears the motto Qui Me Tangit Paenitebit “He who touches me will repent” is inactive, and hosts a historic Regimental Association.

PVT Mills' regiment landed on [Utah Beach](#), Normandy on the 6th day after D-Day as part of Operation Overlord, on 12 June 1944, then attacked the German lines at Valognes and [Cherbourg Naval Base](#). They took For du Roule after a heavy engagement and took Cherbourg on 25 June. He held the defensive line at the [Ollonde River](#) until 2 July 1944 and then returned to the offensive, taking La Haye du Puits in house-to-house fighting, 8 July.

On 25 July, as the 79th attacked across the Ay River to take Lessay, PVT mills was killed in action. He is buried at the Normandy American Cemetery Solleville-sur-Mer, France.

# ***The Family Fully Alive***

## ***Building the Domestic Church***

The following are excerpts from a Knights of Columbus publication—the Family Fully Alive

### **MEDITATIONS ON FAMILY LIFE**



#### **Ancestral Heritage**

For the Christian community the family is far more than a “theme”: it is life, it is the daily fabric of life, it is the journey of generations who pass on the faith together with love and with the basic moral values. It is concrete solidarity, effort, patience, and also a project, hope, a future. All this which the Christian community lives out in the light of faith, hope and charity, should never be kept to oneself but must become, every day, the leaven in the dough of the whole of society for its greater common good.

Hope and a future presuppose memory. The memory of our elderly people sustains us as we journey on. The future of society ... is rooted in the elderly and in the young: the latter, because they have the strength and are of the age to carry history ahead; the former, because they are a living memory. A people that does not take care of its elderly, its children and its youth has no future, because it abuses both memory and promise.

*Message to Participants in the 47th Social Week of Italian Catholics*

1. Who is one person in my family whose faith shaped my own faith?
2. What are some ways our family tries to live out belief in God and his Church?
3. Which virtue seems to be particularly strong in our family — faith, hope or charity?
4. Why is memory important to the future?
5. What strengths do the children in our family have?

#### **Family and the Sabbath Rest**

In the Gospel we do not find discourses on the family but an event which is worth more than any words: *God wanted to be born and to grow up in a human family*. In this way he consecrated the family as the first and ordinary means of his encounter with humanity.

In his life spent at Nazareth, Jesus honored the Virgin Mary and the righteous Joseph, remaining under their authority throughout the period of his childhood and his ado-

lescence. In this way he shed light on the primary value of the family in the education of the person.

Jesus was introduced by Mary and Joseph into the religious community and frequented the synagogue of Nazareth. With them, he learned to make the pilgrimage to Jerusalem, as the Gospel passage offered for our meditation by today’s liturgy tells us.

When he was 12 years old, he stayed behind in the Temple and it took his parents all of three days to find him. With this act he made them understand that he “had to see to his Father’s affairs,” in other words, to the mission that God had entrusted to him.

This Gospel episode reveals the most authentic and profound vocation of the family: that is, to accompany each of its members on the path of the discovery of God and of the plan that he has prepared for him or her.

Mary and Joseph taught Jesus primarily by their example: in his parents he came to know the full beauty of faith, of love for God and for his Law, as well as the demands of justice, which is totally fulfilled in love.

From them he learned that it is necessary first of all to do God’s will, and that the spiritual bond is worth more than the bond of kinship.

The Holy Family of Nazareth is truly the “prototype” of every Christian family which, united in the sacrament of marriage and nourished by the Word and the Eucharist, is called to carry out the wonderful vocation and mission of being the living cell not only of society but also of the Church, a sign and instrument of unity for the entire human race.

Let us now invoke for every family, especially families in difficulty, the protection of Mary Most Holy and of St. Joseph. May they sustain such families so that they can resist the disintegrating forces of a certain contemporary culture which undermines the very foundations of the family institution.

May they help Christian families to be, in every part of the world, living images of God’s love.
